PALM SUNDAY / SUNDAY OF THE PASSION

The Cross-Shaped Throne

April 14, 2019

AS WE GATHER

Today's liturgy is full of contrasts. We recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, with its pomp and pageantry. Then we plunge into the Passion, which ends with Jesus' burial. There is a unifying factor: On Sunday, the crowds hailed Jesus as the King of Israel, and on Friday He reigned from His cruel throne, the cross. There He destroyed death for the sake of His subjects. We offer thanksgiving for His royal, benevolent rule over us and all who bend the knee and call Jesus Lord.

MEMORY VERSE OF THE MONTH

Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live." *John 11:25*

are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him."
