We learn it again and again all through our lives as children of God. This catechetical service teaches and reviews the basic teachings of the Christian faith drawn from God's Word. These are explained in simple form in Luther's Catechism. The six chief parts are The Ten Commandments, The Creed, The Lord's Prayer, The Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Confession, and The Sacrament of the Altar. God grant that our worship assist us in learning, memorizing, taking to heart, and living out these teachings of God's Word in our Christian lives.

INVOCATION The Small Catechism: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Matthew 28:19; Ephesians 4:4-6; Acts 2:38-39; Romans 6:4

Pastor: Baptized children of God, these are the words with which our good and gracious God

first brings us to faith, makes us His own, and continues to wash our sins away. Our

Lord Jesus Christ said,

People: Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them . . .

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION The Small Catechism: Confession
Matthew 16:19: John 20:23

Pastor: God's Law is good, but we have failed to obey it. God calls us to confess our sins

against Him and His commandments and receive His forgiveness through Jesus

Christ, our Savior.

People: "Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we

receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in

heaven."

Pastor: "The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church

on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the

unrepentant as long as they do not repent."

People: Jesus said to His disciples, "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven."

Pastor: He also said, "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold

forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

Let us then sincerely confess our sins and ask God to forgive us.

People: As a poor and miserable sinner from birth, I plead guilty before You, O God, of

all my sins. I have broken Your commandments. I have not kept Your Law. I have been disobedient to You in thought, word, and deed, and I have done harm to others. I am sorry that I have sinned, and I ask You, O God, to accept the sacrifice of Jesus Christ as payment for all my sins. Forgive me, I pray, and

clear me of all guilt and shame.

Pastor: Let it be done for you as you believe. I, by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ,

forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♥ Son and of the Holy

Spirit. Amen. God's peace be with you.

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah 35:4–7a* (The ears of the deaf will be unstopped.)

⁴ Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." ⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶ then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. For waters break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; ⁷ the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE James 2:1–10, 14–18 (I will show you my faith by what I do.)

My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. ² For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, ³ and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, "You sit here in a good place," while you say to the poor man, "You stand over there," or, "Sit down at my feet," ⁴ have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? ⁵ Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which he has promised to those who love him? ⁶ But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you into court? ⁷ Are they not the ones who blaspheme the honorable name by which you were called? ⁸ If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. ⁹ But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰ For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it. ¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?

Can that faith save him? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? ¹⁷ So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ¹⁸ But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works.

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the seventh chapter.


People: Glory to You, O Lord.

²⁴ And from there he arose and went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And he entered a house and did not want anyone to know, yet he could not be hidden. ²⁵ But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet. ²⁶ Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophoenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷ And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." ²⁸ But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs."29 And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter." ³⁰ And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone. ³¹ Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. 32 And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. 33 And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. ³⁴ And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." 35 And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶ And Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷ And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."
