

AS WE GATHER

The full identity of Jesus, which is revealed during the Epiphany season, demonstrates beyond a doubt that He is both human and divine. In the nativity accounts, the Gospel writers focus on the humanity of Jesus—that He is born a human baby and grows up with full humanity. In Epiphany, His divinity is revealed as well through His miraculous acts. As Paul wrote to the followers of Christ in Colossae of Jesus: "In Him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have been filled in Him, who is the head of all rule and authority" (Colossians 2:9–10). We rejoice in coming to know more fully the Christ who fills us with His Spirit and His love

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah 49:1*–7 (The Light for the Gentiles has come.)

Listen to me, O coastlands, and give attention, you peoples from afar.
